

CHART OUTCOMES ASSESSMENT

Community Rehabilitation Services uses portions of the Craig Handicap Assessment and Reporting Technique (CHART), developed by Craig Hospital, to assess functional status at admission, discharge and three-month follow-up. Functional status is assessed in the following domains:

- **Physical Independence** – Ability for a patient to function independently without supervision.
- **Cognitive Independence** – Ability to think, remember and make decisions independently.
- **Mobility** – Ability to get out of bed and out of the house independently.
- **Occupation** – Ability to return to

productive life activities such as work, school, homemaking, etc.

- **Social Integration** – Social and/or work contacts initiated.

Data is analyzed quarterly and annually as follows:

- **Program effectiveness** – The percent of change experienced by a person from admission to discharge. This allows individuals of differing diagnoses and admission levels to be analyzed collectively.
- **Durability of outcomes** – The percent of individuals who maintain and/or increase their follow-up scores in comparison to those achieved at discharge.
